Introduction

Suchitra Mattai is a multi-disciplinary artist who was born in Guyana, South America. Her work communicates the complexities of living amidst multiple cultural spheres and explores how individual and collective memory allows us to unravel dominant historical narratives. Recent projects include a commission for the Sharjah Biennial 14, inclusion in “State of the Art 2020” at Crystal Bridges Museum/the Momentary and a Denver Art Museum/Biennial of the Americas jointly sponsored installation. Upcoming projects include solos at Building Bridges Art Exchange (Los Angeles) and the Boise Museum of Art (Idaho) and a group exhibition at the Art Gallery of Ontario (Toronto). Her work is in museum and private collections including Crystal Bridges Museum, the Denver Art Museum, and the TIA Collection. Suchitra received an MFA in Painting and Drawing and an MA in South Asian art, both from the University of Pennsylvania, Philadelphia.
